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Personal Journal

Students are asked to develop their daily journal beginning Thursday, May 15th, Week 1, and ending August 17th, Week 14. The daily journal will include: reflections (state the scripture passage read, and what the passage said to you), Bible study notes, sermon notes, daily insights, and any other areas of spiritual discipline as discussed in the course. More will be discussed in week 2.

Final Project

The final project consists of a Personal Journal report. The report will consist of a 2-3 page reflection paper detailing the student experience with journaling. Details include strengths, weaknesses, lessons learned, etc. Furthermore, submitting the project on time is vital to ensure the Professor has time to provide constructive feedback. More will be discussed later in the course.

General Information

- 1. Tone and Attitude: One of the purposes of this course is to hone our skills in dealing with difficult life situations. Therefore, all written posts, emails, responses, and papers will be evaluated for the student¢s ability to express their disagreement with an issue in a Christian and professional manner. A negative tone or attitude toward the course facilitator or fellow students will not be tolerated. Disagreements should be handled professionally and spiritually.
- 2. **Participation**: Participation in an online learning environment is vital to the successful completion of this course of study. Communication may be via phone, email or a personal visit. Each student should contact the Professor at least once during the course. Participation in the course includes applicable comments and questions in the course.
